In reply I beg to say that the admission of this girl is approved. It is noticed by the doctor's certificate that she has enlarged tonsils. Proper attention should be given to this girl's case at once.

I have also to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant enclosing the March quarter return of this school.

You will be good enough to state whether Amelia Samson is one of the pupils who was transferred from the All Hallows Boarding School, as her name did not appear on the last return from that school, previous to its closing If she was not a pupil in that school, an application and certificate of health should be forwarded for her.

It is considered that the principal should give new register numbers to all the girls in the school beginning with No. Ol and following numbers consecutively, and they should appear on the quarterly returns in future in regular order. You will be good enough to inform him accordingly.
