Ottawa, June 19, 1919.

Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th instant, in which you state that Jesse Ritchie, Band No. 129, wishes to have his stepdaughter, Lucy Moses, placed in the Shingwauk Home.

In reply I beg to say that the Department is making arrangements to send a number of children to the Shingwauk Home and if this girl is found to be eligible for admission she could be sent at that time. You will be good enough to forward an application for her admission made out on the proper form for that purpose, signed by the stepfather and also have the girl examined by a doctor and the certificate of health form filled in and signed by him. You should attend to this matter at once and forward the application and certificate of health as soon as possible.

If this girl is in good health and a protestant the Department will consent to her admission and you will receive further instructions regarding the sending of her to the school.
