the nearest authorized physician for medical examination. Those who pass medical examination report for training, unless exemption is granted.

In response to the first call, 27,559 men appeared. Of these, 2034 were rejected after a second medical examination at the training centres.

Exemptions

- 1) On account of previous training,
- 2) Mennonites and Doukhobors,
- 3) University students who are receiving approved military training in connection with their courses.
- 4) Conscientious objecters.

Postponements

- 1) Men engaged in seasonal occupations may, at discretion of boards, have service postponed to slack season (e.g. farming, fishing, lumbering and trapping)
- 2) Representatives of industry may appeal to the boards for postponement in cases where absence of employees would seriously impair efficiency of essential industries.
