INVERNESS-SHIRE CONSTABULARY.

Statement made by Detective Sergeant Gregor Calder Urquhart of the Inverness-shire Constabulary - Re. charge against No. K.99014, Sergeant J. G. Greenwood, dated this 5th day of November, 1943.

On Thursday, 7th October, 1943, I was detailed by Deputy Chief Constable Mackay to investigate a theft of Reserve Rations at No. 7 Coy., Canadian Forestry Corps Camp. Upon making a search of Archibald MacDonald's residence at Easthill, Culloden Moor, I found 6-2 lbs. tins of Greengage Jam which he said he obtained from Mrs. Greenwood, wife of Sergeant Greenwood, on 5th October, 1943. MacDonald also advised that Mrs. Greenwood had just moved to No. 6 Glemurquhart Road, Inverness and I would probably be able to locate more of the stolen rations there. This I did. On arrival there we saw Sgt. Greenwood. I informed him of the purpose of my visit and enquired if he had any objection to us searching the house. Both he and his mother-in-law, Mrs. Fairweather, consented to the search. I found a tin containing approximately 8½ lbs. of sugar, another tin containing 7½ lbs. of Tea also 22-2 lb. tins of Greengage Jam. Mrs. Greenwood volunteered the statement that the 22 tins of Jam were taken to Easthill by her husband one night the previous week, Mrs. Greenwood apparently being under the impression that her husband got them as a present. These Reserve Rations were also conveyed to the County Police Headquarters.

I charged Sgt. Greenwood with Reset on the 9th October, 1943, and he replied - "I told you everything yesterday I possibly could. I have nothing to add or draw back".
