

THE TOWN OF

North Battleford.

Eleven months ago, June 1st. 1905, there was but one building on the townsite of North Battleford. To-day it is a bustling busy town of seven hundred inhabitants, with almost all lines of business represented.

It is a freight and passenger divisional point on the trunk line of the Canadian Northern Railway, and is destined to be one of the important railway centres of Saskatchewan. It occupies a commanding position on the North Saskatchewan River, and already a number of railways are projected towards this junction point, namely:

The Calgary Red Deer and Battleford.
The Grand Trunk Pacific.
The Hudson Bay Railway.
The Saskatchewan Central, and
The Prince Albert and North Battleford.

Already, \$200,000 worth of improvements and buildings have been erected in the town, which is now the centre of trade and commerce of a large tributary district. Good trails radiate to the rich farming districts of Goose Lake, Round Hill, Meeting Lake, Jack Fish
