TWO KILLED AND ONE MISSING IS TOLL OF MEN FOR TO-DAY

Two Men in Addition are Reported Wounded - Pte. Frank Betts and Albert Sage Make Supreme Sacrifice... Two Prisoners, Two Missing and One Wounded From Paris.

The toll of casualties in to-day is very heavy, and the number killed is the regrettable feature. Pte. Frank Betts, Pte. Albert Sage are killed, Pte. Albert Victor Stuart is missing, Pte. John Bearfoot and Pte. Roy Carter are wounded.

action, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. Margaret Betts, 41 Ontario St. The date of his death was June 13th. A sad feature of his case is that only three months ago a brother of his, Pte. Wm. Betts, also was killed "somewhere in France."

With First Contingent Pte. Frank Betts left with the first contingent, and was wounded at the battle of Langemarck, April, 1915. He returned to the front on March 25th of this year, the day his brother was killed. He was 30 years of age, and single. Before enlisting, he was employed at the Adams' Wagon Works.

A few days ago, the last letter he will ever write, was received here by his brother. It runs in part as follows: "Just a few lines to let you know I am still alive. I guess you have heard about the doings out here by now. I am going into battle to-night so I am taking this chance of writing you, perhaps, it will be my last. If I go to the happy hunting grounds, I please do not feel bad as my troubles

and worries will be over. It is going to be bloody work. It is just a year ago since I arrived at Shorncliffe (wounded after Langemarck). Wonder if I'll ever see it again. This is all now. I'll close before a shell lands and does it for me. Well, goodbye, all. Hoping I am spared to write again."

Pte. Sage. Word was received this morning that Pte. Albert N. Sage, 183 Elgin street, was killed in action, on June 16th. His mother, Mrs. Minnie Sage, had the telegram, conveying the news placed in her hands this morning.

Pte. Sage was a single man, only 20 years of age, who went overseas with the 36th Battalion, and was afterwards drafted. He worked at Ham and Notts. He has a brother, Ernest, in the 13th battery. He was an Englishman, coming to Canada five years ago.

He has two brothers-in-law in khaki, Gunner Arthur Fisher at the front and Pte. James Meids of the 21st. His parents, one brother at home, one at the front, and three sisters survive him. They are Mrs. Meids and Mrs. Arthur Fisher of the front and Mrs. Edward Parker, of Niagara Falls.

A. V. Stuart Missing. Word was received this morning by Mrs. Thomas Stuart, 142 Alfred street, that her son, Albert Victor Stuart, of the C.M.R., was "missing" since June 2nd. Prior to enlistment he was a coremaker at Gould, Shapley and Muir's.

Pte. Bearfoot. This morning's official casualty list contains the name of Pte. John Bearfoot, wounded. Pte. Bearfoot is a member of the Six Nations Indians, having enlisted in September, 1914, and gone overseas with the second contingent. He is a married man with a family, and resides near the Reserve. He is a descendant of Chief Joseph Brant.

Pte. Roy Carter. Mrs. Carter, 189 Eagle Avenue, received a telegram that her son, Roy, was wounded on the 13th, in the front and admitted to No. 3 General Hospital, Boulogne. He left with the 36th Battery, and left England on the 6th of June. When he enlisted he was employed at the Brandon Shoe Company.

The List From Paris. (From our own correspondent.) Paris, June 29.—Robert, Mullender, C.M.R., previously reported missing now officially reported prisoner. He enlisted with the 26th Dragoon. Harold Joseph Smith, formerly with Penmans, Limited, is also a prisoner. His wife sailed for England last week.

Chas. Ball, of Upper Town, has been missing since June 2nd, according to a message received here this morning. P. S. Taylor, whose parents live at Canning, is also reported missing.
