St. Thomas, Nov. 23.—A message was received yesterday announcing the death of Alfred Wilkinson in Detroit. The deceased was a son of the late Jonathan Wilkinson founder of The St. Thomas Times, and was a brother of W. J. Wilkinson, news editor of The Toronto Mail and Empire.
