The meeting of the Liberal Conservative Association held in Harris' Hall on Wednesday evening last, was well attended and was most enthusiastic throughout. The subject under discussion was the "Manitoba School Question." Mr. H. G. Harris, our popular and talented young barrister, was the first speaker, and presented the legal aspect of the case in a masterly and eloquent speech, of about fourteen minutes' duration. He quoted at length from the Manitoba Act and the report of the Privy Council, and dealt with some of the salient features of the Remedial Bill, elucidating its workings and probable effects. In most exciting and denunciatory terms he referred to the leader of the opposition and his followers for their inconsistent stand on this question. Mr. Harris was cheered to the echo, and received his seat amid prolonged applause. Brief and vigorous speeches were delivered by other prominent members of the party.
