—Farmers who do not keep a large

stock of cattle should not hesitate to

use in judicious quantities some reli-

able chemical fertilizer, many brands

of which are on the market. The

idea formerly existed, and yet

has a grip on some, that these fertil-

izers act on the soil in much the same

way as medicine does on the human

system. That they possess no real

nutrition in themselves but prove

beneficial by stimulating the soil to

further action and when the effects

have passed leave the land in a worse

condition than before. This is en-

tirely erroneous. Agents like im-

pure salt have no great value as plant

food inasmuch as their effect is quite

as much physical as chemical. With

the various nitrogenous and phospho-

ric manures, as guano, superphosphate

and other bone preparations, a series of

compounds are put into the soil upon

which the plant lives and of which it

builds its tissue. It is akin to feeding

a cow good rich food. If she is

fed with willow she will show her food

in the milk pail, and if the fertilizer

is in good form easily soluble, a

point of great consideration when its

effects are intended to be immediate

they should show their presence in the

crops. Where so much hay is sold as

in this locality nothing will save the

fertility of the soil except a judicious

use of chemical fertilizer. It is harm-

less, cheap. Try some.
