

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1). At least six months' reslence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2). A homesteader may, if Me so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farm-ing land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his home-stead. Joint ownership in !and will not meet this requirement.

(3). If the father (or mother, the father is deceased , of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely, by hins, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or) mother)

(4). The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the neasurement.

(5). A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commission c of Dominion Lands at Ottane of intention to apply for patent. W. W. CORV,
