LONDON, August 8. The British War Office has special reason to mourn the loss of his valuable services, both as regards his manlifting kites and his contributions to military aeronauties."

PARIS, August 8. The French Senate adopted to-day by a vote of 254 to 37, the bill introducing the three years' service for soldiers in the French Army measure. By increasing the term from two to three years adds 210,000 men at the lowest estimate to the peace footing of the French Army, thus bringing the total up to nearly 800,-000 men. The service in future begins at the age of 20, instead of 21.
