The Turkish Consul here to-day stated that the story published here and also in London to the effect that Nedjemkden Effendi and Fassun Effendi came to Switzerland as representatives of their Government, with the object of opening pourparlers for a separate peace with the Triple Entente, is untrue. "Even if she wished, Turkey cannot make a separate peace," declared the Consul. However, peace rumors continue. By a curious coincidence, Abbas Hilmi, former Khedive of Egypt, also arrived at Lausanne from Vienna. He is travelling incognito.
