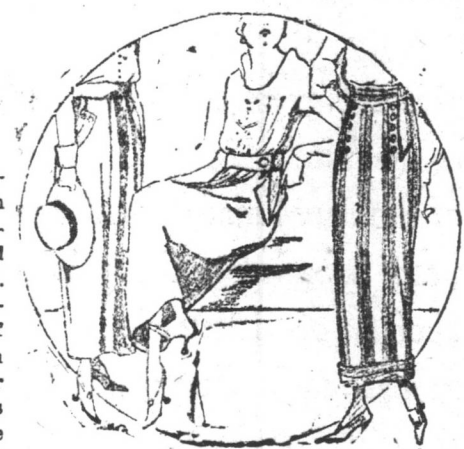

Welcome Home at St. George's.

The social event of the season took place in the Court House at St. George's, when the beautiful Festival of Welcome gotten up by Mrs. Commander Carter, and Miss Margaret White, of the White House, was celebrated. All the elite of St. George's and the nearby towns attended, and for harmony and good feeling, and for beautiful costumes, and excellently ordered arrangements, the occasion is long to be remembered.

The Court House was beautifully decorated in white and green and a proud display was made of patriotic bunting. The refreshments served showed the acquaintance of the ladies who served them, with the most delicate artistry in culinary masterpieces.

Among the guests from a distance were Mr. and Mrs. McIsaac and Pta. Ralph Nardini, from Nardini's Crossing, Mr. and Mrs. Story, of Whiteholm, Mr. Edward Halliburton, of the Royal Naval Reserve, and other members of the Halliburton family from Port au Port. All the leading citizens of Sandy Point were present. It would be a much easier task to mention those who were not present. All went indeed as "merry as a marriage bell," and soon "music arose with its voluptuous swell," and the word went round, "on with the dance—let joy be unconfined."

At midnight the soldiers and sailors formed ranks, and an address of greeting delivered, at the request of the ladies, by A. J. O'Reilly J. P. who at the end of the Grand March read to Sergeant Major and Mrs. Alfred White the appended Address. The presentation, a set of napkin rings of the precious metal, beautifully engraved was made by Mrs. Commander Carter. This address pays a well merited tribute to the Scotch people for their kindness and hospitality to our boys while in their beautiful country. Following is the address.

ADDRESS.

To Sergeant Major and Mrs. Alfred White.

Dear Mr. White,—We are pleased to be able to take advantage of this festival in honor of the returned soldiers and sailors, to thus publicly welcome you and your wife—to welcome you to the land of your birth, which you left to fight for Freedom and Justice, overseas—to welcome her to the land of her adoption,—her future home.

Many of our boys have returned covered with glory, returned with spoils of the enemy. Many of them were renowned for their prowess in capturing prisoners,—but of all the trophies of war the fairest and sweetest has fallen to Sergeant Major White, who has captured a fair-haired Scotch lassie, and brought her home—a prisoner—not of war, but of love.

More especially to you, Dear Mrs. White, do we wish to tender a hearty Newfoundland welcome. We welcome you for yourself. We welcome you as the representative among us of that kind-hearted and generous people, the Scottish Nation, who took the boys of our Island to their hearts and homes, who opened to them their hearts, who gave them of their famed and open-handed hospitality, and who, as a crowning boon, bestowed upon them some of Scotland's own fair daughters to be the mothers of heroes in the coming years. Should Mrs. White ever be lonely she has only to remember that St. George's may be looked upon as the Lowlands, and not far away is our own Highlands where the true Celtic Blood pulses as purely and as loyally through the veins of its inhabitants as in the famed Highlands of Scotland itself.

And now, Dear Mr. and Mrs. White, as a mark of appreciation from the returned soldiers and sailors, we beg you to accept from us the accompanying gift which we trust will remain in the family as a memento of the Great War, and we hope that in the coming years, as you sit around the Christmas fire, you may look from the youthful faces to each other with a mutual pride,—the one that he has given to his children a mother from one of the bravest nations in Europe,—the other, that she has selected her husband from a little Country whose sons "Did better than the best."
