ACCIDENT TO OCEAN LIMITED. QUEBEC, May 1.

Shaken into consciousness from their sleep when engineer Joseph Gagnon jammed on the brakes in an effort to save their train from wreck, some hundreds of passengers of the Ocean Limited, the Canadian National Railways "million dollar" train from Montreal to Halifax, turned out in pouring ran, about one and a quarter miles east of Levis, in what clothes they could hurriedly put on, early this morning, to find that the engineer, and fireman Emile Courtier, had gone over a 12 foot embankment with their locomotive and were imprisoned there, while mail and express cars were derailed on and around the track. The cause of the wreck were boulders which had fallen down from a cliff.
