The hospitals report for the year 1896 is just complete. During the past year the Government has decided to give aid to the following hospitals: General Hospital, Huntsville; Woodstock Hospital; Berlin-Waterloo Hospital; Maternity Hospital, Ottawa; Application has been made to purchase the General Hospital, Sarnia; Huntsville Hospital; Western Hospital, Toronto.

The vincennes aid is now granted to 39 hospitals, and the grant in the estimates this year is \$110,000. Last year 17,571 patients were treated, while in 1895 the number was only 16,161. Deaths only numbered 1,042, showing the death rate to be exceedingly small.
