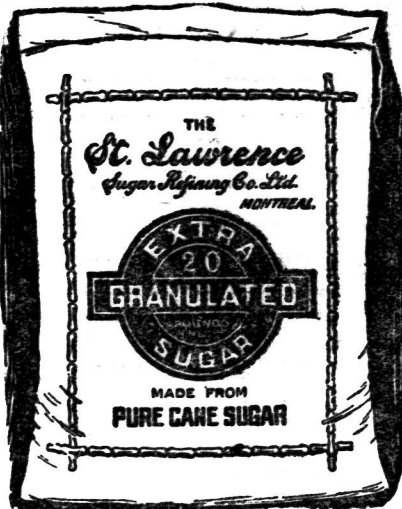

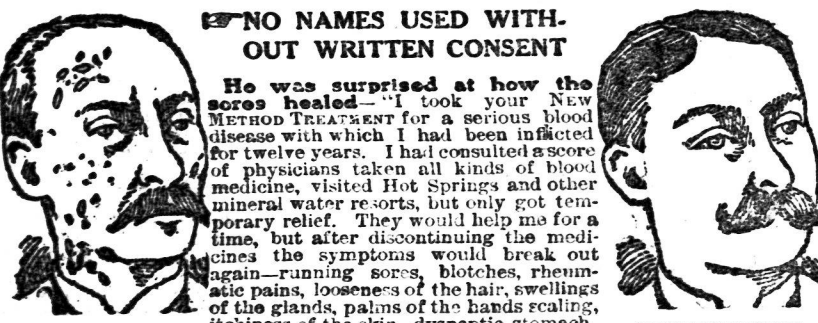

ALL WORLD WATCHING CANADA'S NAVY

Rear-Admiral Lyons Says Its Success Depends Upon the People.

Victoria, B. C., Aug. 10.—"The success or otherwise of the Canadian navy depends wholly upon the Canadian people. If they set out to make a navy they can do it, but if they are half-hearted the plan will not amount to anything. The movement of Canada in this respect is being watched by the whole world."

This was the statement made by Rear-Admiral Lyons, of the Royal Navy, who is returning from China, where he has command of the China station. Discussing the Canadian action further, Admiral Lyons said the navy did not depend upon legislation, but upon the men and brains that were put into it. With times so good as they were in Canada at the present time he felt that it would be difficult to get young men to enter the navy as a profession. Admiral Lyons said he was glad to know that Canadians are interested in naval affairs, but he was afraid that those on the coast were speaking only for themselves and not for the farmers of the interior.

SOME BOY SCOUTS TO SEE REAL INDIANS

Fourteen London Lads On Camping and Canoe Trip of Realistic Features in Canada.

London, Aug. 10.—Scouting in real earnest—camping, canoeing, fishing, and tracking in the land of Fenimore Cooper and Capt. Mayne Reid, in the company of live red Indians and weather-beaten trappers—is the latest move on the part of the boy scouts of London. This is to be the lot of fourteen lucky boy scouts who left on July 29 en route for Canada and the "wild west."

The expedition, of which Scout Masters E. G. S. Walker and Capt. Wade are in charge, will land at Quebec, proceed thence by the Canadian Pacific Railway to Alberta, and, with the exception of a few brief visits to some of the large cities, will keep strictly to prairie, mountain and forest.

"We want to give the boys a taste of the real thing," said Mr. Walker to a correspondent. "We want them to have experience of woodcraft and camp life in a land where such things really count. We shall first camp near a ranch in Alberta. Here the boys will be able to see what real cowboys are like, what they have to do, how the cattle are looked after—in fact, everything pertaining to the management of a ranch."

"Near here we are going to enlist the services of some Redskins, either Creeks or Blackfeet, who will give us hints in the art of tracking. We shall send a boy scout forward for a couple of miles or so, and then, with the aid of the red Indians, track him down and come up with him again. We shall also get trappers to show us how to recognize the tracks of different animals and how best to follow them. We shall live in the open all the time. In which all our baggage, including cooking utensils, etc., will be stored, and which we shall drag ourselves. We are not an armed party and shall boast only one small rifle, with which the boys will be taught to shoot."

CURLS AND COILS IN NEW COIFFURE

London Women Also Find the Gigantic Hat On the Wane and Manager Explains Reason.

London, Aug. 10.—Even to mere man, unobservant of details of women's fashions, the disappearance of the chignon is obvious, and the style beloved by early Victorian dames has given place to elaborate clusters of curls swathed in coils.

The change does not appear, however, to be agreeable to many women, since a tremendous quantity of hair is necessary for the successful achievement of this head dress. The demand for artificial tresses accordingly has never been greater than it is today, and the result is that hair is selling at a premium.

Switches which could have been purchased for 45 last season are now unobtainable at less than 75c a time. That amount, women and their husbands grumble that the attainment of a fashionable coiffure is becoming almost as expensive as the purchase of a fashionable hat.

There are also signs of another change in that the day of the gigantic hat is on the wane, and experts say that smaller hats will be fashionable the coming fall. The manager of one of the leading millinery establishments in the city is today a very good reason for the arrival of the smaller hat.

"When wintry weather arrives," he says, "women want to ride in closed automobiles and taxicabs, and they find that there is not sufficient room for themselves and the giant hats. Hats are always inclined to shrink to smaller proportions directly the summer is over, but anyone who imagines that we are going back to the tiny hats is much mistaken."

"Matinee toques are the nearest approach to the 'little hat,' and we have just brought out a pretty fashion. It consists of little gold or silver net not quite trimmed with tiny wreaths of wild flowers, which are worn under the large picture hats. At a matinee the large hat can be lifted off, and the little cap not only makes a pretty head-dress, but keeps the hair tidy."

NOTED TORONTO ACTRESS DEAD

Was Manager of First Grand Opera House at Queen City.

Toronto, Aug. 10.—Forty years ago the actress who most delighted the citizens of Toronto was Mrs. Charlotte Morrison, who earned her first success on the stage as Miss Charlotte Nickinson. Yesterday she died at her residence, 90 St. Joseph street, Toronto, after having been in feeble health for some time. Two daughters, Mrs. E. B. Brown, 113 St. Clair avenue, and Mrs. Raynald Morrison, also a son, Mr. Stuart Morrison, survive.

A FALLS FISH STORY.

Niagara Falls, N.Y., Aug. 10.—One of the oddest and most sensational accidents that has ever happened on the upper river occurred last night at 10 o'clock, off La Salle, two miles above the Falls, when a 150-pound sturgeon leaped into a small motor boat, striking one of the occupants in the back and struggling so violently that it put the engine out of commission and set the boat drifting for the cataract.

Sebastian Smith, owner of the boat, put out from La Salle about 9 o'clock with Miss Nellie Johnson and Frank Lonsdale, of this city. The craft had a powerful searchlight in the bow and as the boat was returning down stream, the sturgeon, which measured seven feet in length, leaped for the light and in its jump struck Miss Johnson full on the back, seriously injuring her.

The engine was soon stopped by the fish and the men had to fight it with oars and knives for twenty minutes before it was subdued. George Allen, of La Salle, heard their cries of distress as they rushed towards the fall and put out to them and towed them ashore with his motor boat. Miss Johnson's condition is critical.

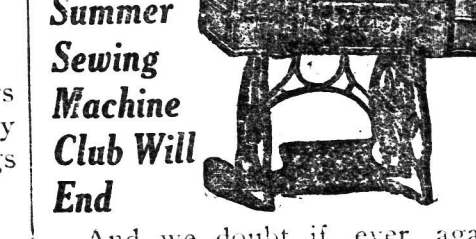
