

# **DEBT OF CANADA IS CUT MORE THAN 16 MILLION**

Advance Sale Through City Ordinary Revenue Increases by Nearly Three Million During First Four Months of Year, While Expenditures Are Cut by \$890,849 During Same Period.

> Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 7 .- Canada's ordinary revenue for the four months of the present fiscal year ended on July 31 last shows an increase of \$2,932,163 over the same four-month period last year, according to the books of the Department of Finance. Ordinary revenue for the four months of 1925 which have elapsed amounted to \$141,739,416. For the same four months of 1924, the amount was

The final statement issued today shows a decrease in ordinary expenditure for the four-month period of \$890,849. Ordinary expenditures for that part of the fiscal year which had elapsed on July 31 amounted to \$95,655,692. The monthly figures, however, show an increase in ordinary expenditures last month as compared with

The total net debt of Canada on July 31 of the present year stood at \$2,375,249,305. This is a decrease from the net debt on the

London, Aug. 7 .- Louis Philippe, Duke of Orleans, who has lived in exile in England for forty years, has made an impassioned plea for permission to return to France to spend his declining years.



## RAYON

What It Is and How It Is Made.

Rayon is a vegetable fibre made by transforming cellulose into filaments by means of chemical and mechanical process. This cellulose is a substance on which the silk worm feeds. Hence silk and Rayon are made of the same substance, but the silk worm produces an animal fibre, whereas the chemical treatment produces a vegetable fibre.

Rayon is the most staple fibre on the market today because it is not dependent on the crops or the seasons. As long as we have plant life we will have cellulose, and hence Rayon.

In the process of making, cellulose in its purest form is converted to a liquid from whence by chemical process the solution is shaped to form fibre filaments and the chemicals removed.

These filaments, twisted together, form Rayon thread. The thread then undergoes various finishing processes and is reeled into skeins, sorted and graded, and is then delivered to the garment manu-
