The principal reforms demanded are that the governors and vice governors of Van, Erzeroum, Sivas, Bitlis, Kharoat and Trebizonde be Christian, or Mussulman, ac-

cording to how the population of those places is divided. In any case the governor or the vice-governor is to be a Christian.
