In the matter of all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Toronto in the County of York and in the Province of Ontario.

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the order of His Honor the Judge in Chambers, dated the 18th day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Whereas R. B. Dand and others have petitioned for the extension and opening up of St. Paul-street from its present southern termination to King-street in the Ward of St. David.

And whereas the said Petition was duly signed by two-thirds in number of the real property more than one-half of the real property immediately benefited by the said improvement pursuant to the statute in that behalf.

And whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said Petition and open up and extend the said St. Paul-street as a local improvement at the expense of the real property immediately benefited.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the City of Toronto enact as follows: That St. Paul-street, in the Ward of St. David, in the City of Toronto, be and the same is hereby extended, established and opened up from its present southern termination to King-street.
