### TWELFTH YEAR STORAGE VERSUS TROLLEY.

THE FATHER OF TROLLEY CARS. From the Ontario Electrician.

New York, March 20.—Charles J. Van Depole, who was a pioneer in adapting electricity to mining and who invented a trolley street railway system, died in Lynn, Mass., yesterday. Pneumonia was the cause.

Mr. Van Depole's hobby was the propulsion of street cars by electricity, and his first successful experiment was made in 1828. The pioneer commercial road was equipped in South Bend, Ind., in 1832. Within six years 10 roads were in successful operation. Mr. Van Depole's system, however, was generally called the trolley system.

In 1838 the Van Depole Company sold out the electric railway system, patents and business to the Thomson-Houston Electric Company of Boston, whose services Mr. Van Depole entered as an electrician.

Mr. Van Depole also produced a great number of commutatorless motors, both rotary and reciprocating, the latter being especially adapted for rock-drilling.
