APPLICATION TO PARLIAMENT The Bankruptcy Act

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT an application will be made by the Board of Governors of Western University, of London, Ontario, to the Legislature of the Province of Ontario at its next session, for amending act to its Act of Incorporation, 8th Edward VII, Chapter 145, to include the following:

1. To change the name of the University to "The University of Western Ontario."
2. To authorize the City of London to continue to make grants to the University without obtaining the assent of the ratepayers.
3. To authorize the council of any county or municipality in Western Ontario, that is, in the counties of Essex, Kent, Elgin, Norfolk, Lambton, Middlesex, Oxford, Brant, Huron, Bruce, Grey, Perth, Wellington and Waterloo, to make grants in aid of the University for any purpose they may deem prudent without obtaining the assent of the ratepayers. Such grants may provide for capital expenditure or generally for the maintenance or for the promotion of any work undertaken by the University either for its own students or for those of affiliated institutions.
4. To provide for the appointment of an Official Visitor.
5. To authorize the University Council to consist of the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, the Board of Governors, the Senate, the officers, faculties, graduate and undergraduate of the University and the official heads of each county and city in Western Ontario.
6. To constitute the Board of Governors as follows: From the City of London, five members; from the University the City Council shall appoint four Governors; the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario shall appoint four Governors, and these shall elect four more. The Chancellor and the President of the University shall be ex-officio members of the Board. All Governors shall hold office for one year. Five shall constitute a quorum. No person shall be eligible to serve on the Board unless he is a British subject and a resident of Ontario.
7. To define the duties and powers of the Board and to give it authority to control the property and business of the University subject to the terms of any trust effecting any monies or properties which may come into the possession of the University.
8. To authorize gifts to the University by individuals or organizations.
9. To authorize the Board to sell or acquire property for the University, to borrow money on the same and to have all the rights in dealing with property as are possessed by an individual.
10. To provide for proceedings by or against the Board.
11. To provide for the establishment of faculties, departments and chairs and to fix fees.
12. To arrange for the auditing of accounts.
13. To exempt the University property from every description of taxation.
14. To exempt from succession duties all property devised or given to the University.
15. To exempt all officers, teachers and students from religious tests.
16. To constitute a Senate as follows: Two members shall be appointed by each faculty of the University and by each affiliated college or school. Two members shall be appointed by the Board of Governors from their own number. One member may be appointed by the County Council and by the Council of each incorporated city in the following counties: Brant, Bruce, Elgin, Essex, Grey, Huron, Kent, Lambton, Middlesex, Norfolk, Oxford, Perth, Wellington and Waterloo. The principals of the continuation schools, high schools and collegiate institutes in the aforesaid counties may elect four members from their own number. One member shall be appointed by each of the school boards of the City of London. One member may be elected by the graduates of each faculty and one by the graduates of each affiliated college. Certain officers of the University shall be ex-officio members of the Senate. Each Senator shall hold office for two years and shall begin his term with the spring convocation. The Senate shall appoint the Vice-Chancellor of the University.
17. To authorize the Senate to control the educational policy of the University and with the Board to create faculties and establish facilities for teaching any of the arts and sciences.
18. To enable the Senate to confer degrees in any department of learning.
19. To define the duties of the Senate with respect to the educational needs of the University and constituency and with respect to extension work.
20. To provide for the election of a Chancellor.
21. To provide for the affiliation of any college or school in Canada established for teaching divinity, arts, science, medicine, music, engineering, agriculture or any other useful branch of learning.
22. To provide for Theological options for an Arts degree.
23. To provide for conferring honorary degrees, and degrees by examination in Divinity.
24. To perpetuate the government of the University on an absolutely unconditional basis and under public, municipal and provincial control.

Curzon Anxious

Continued From Page One.

There is no objection from London if the French desired to take this course. The French note explaining the situation had not arrived at the foreign office up to 6.30 this afternoon, but the latest dispatches from Lord Curzon do not indicate any change of opinion on the part of the French to break with the allies in order to conclude a separate treaty. Official opinion here does not agree with the French view, who think that a general agreement characterized by the French action as a flagrant violation of the allied plans.

NOTE DELAYED.

PARIS, Jan. 31.—It is understood here that the note of Premier Poincare to M. Curzon is not a final one. The British representative maintains a permanent organization for negotiations at Lausanne or elsewhere between the allies and the Turks. The Echo de Paris, "if so, his viewpoint, with certain modifications, might be made acceptable to London. But if Poincare aims at a separate peace with Turkey, a second rupture with England would be inevitable. CURZON'S ADDRESS.
