He said that in 1896 the farmers of Ontario produced of beet, bacon and cheese products \$31,000,000 worth. In 1906 this had increased to \$65,500,000 worth. The value of Ontario farms, farm buildings, implements and stock was over \$1000,000. ments and stock, was over \$1,000,000,000, and the products of these farms last year (1906) was about \$300,000,000.


