BRITAIN DEPOSITS FIFTY MILLION IN WAR DEBT INTEREST

Washington.—Receipts of \$50,610,000 for the account of the United States Government was reported to the Treasury by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Of the total, \$50,000,000 represents interest on the war debt of Great Britain to the United States and \$610,000 represents interest on the debt representing the loan of silver to Great Britain during the war which is in progress of liquidation, there being \$61,000,000 of this count still outstanding.

A similar payment of \$50,000,000 on October 15th by Great Britain makes a total of \$100,000,000 paid as the first semi-annual installment of interest on the war debt of nearly \$500,000,000, but the two payments are subject to adjustment at five per cent while the debt funding account authorities a rate of not less than four and one quarter per cent.
