THE OPHTHALMO REACTION TO TUBERCULIN.

IN our November (1907) issue, we drew attention, in an editorial note, to the ophthalmo-reaction to tuberculin, a method of diagnosing tuberculosis introduced to the profession by Dr. Calmette, of the Pasteur Institute, Lille. The test is based on a reaction of the conjunctiva to a strong solution of tuberculin. The dry tuberculin is supplied in small tubes containing such
