San Francisco Chinamen have boycotted Mrs. Geary, wife of the author of the Chinese deportation law. As the Chinese are the "hired girls" of the Pacific coast, the situation is said to be embar-

rassing and unpleasant.

"Patriotism" of a peculiar kind was shown in several cities on Decoration Day. In Trenton, Golden Eagle and Malta "Knights" refused to parade with Catholic clubs, and in Pittston the "Patriotic" Sons of America declined to march, because Catholic organizations march because Catholic organizations






