EMIGRATION AND IMMIGRATION, 1960-65

Question No. 1,664—**Mr. Irvine:**

1. How many people left Canada for permanent residence in the United States in each of the years 1960 to 1965 inclusive?

2. How many people arrived in Canada from the United States to take up permanent residence in each of the years 1960 to 1965 inclusive?

3. How many people left Canada to take up permanent residence in all other countries except the United States in each of the years 1960 to 1965 inclusive?

Hon. Judy V. LaMarsh (Secretary of State): I am informed by the Departments of Trade and Commerce and Citizenship and Immigration as follows:

1. Immigrant aliens admitted to United States whose last permanent residence was Canada: Calendar Year; 1960, 48,682; 1961, 45,209; 1962, 47,579; 1963, 51,512; 1964, 49,995; January to June 1965, 22,277.

ROBERVAL CONSTITUENCYQuestion No. 1,666—**Mr. Gauthier:**

Has the Department of Industry spent any money in aid to new industries in the constituency of Roberval in the last four years and, if so (a) how much (b) in which municipalities?

Hon. C. M. Drury (Minister of Industry): The National Employment Service areas of Dolbeau and Roberval, parts of which comprise the Constituency of Roberval, have been designated under the Area Development Program. Seven firms have declared their intentions of establishing or expanding manufacturing or processing operations in the areas in order to qualify for the benefits of the Area Development Incentives Act of June 30, 1965, as follows:

*ANTI-CIGARETTE CAMPAIGN

Question No. 1,687—**Mr. Rynard:**

1. How much money has been spent by the government on the anti-cigarette campaign (a) in the schools (b) in the press (c) in other media?

2. What are the results to date in the prevention of cigarette smoking or in stopping the habit?

3. What further procedures are planned in prevention?

Mrs. Margaret Rideout (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of National Health and Welfare): Because of the length of the reply to starred question 1,687, Mr. Speaker, the answer is being printed in *Hansard*.

Mr. Speaker: Is this agreed?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

[Editor's note: The text of the reply referred to above is as follows:]

1. (a) A total of \$220,074.79 was expended by the Department of National Health and Welfare on the Canadian smoking and health program up to March 31, 1966. It is impossible to determine what proportion of this was used for materials for schools because some items are for the use of the general public as well as schools and we do not know the distribution within individual provinces. (b) \$3,267.60 was spent for an experimental series of display advertisements in a national monthly publication, *Canadian High News*, directed to high school students across the country. (c) Expenditures in other media totalled \$151,953.60. Research expenditures totalled \$64,843.59.

2. We have recognized from the outset that we are involved in a long term program of health education regarding the health hazards of cigarette smoking. The first objective of the program is to inform Canadians about the health hazards of cigarette smoking. Following that, ultimate success will depend upon changes in public attitudes regarding the habit. A survey conducted for my department between November, 1964 and January, 1965, showed that 90 per cent of Canadians were aware of the harmful effects of cigarette
