RIDING MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK—MASTER PLAN

Question No. 1,198—**Mr. Stewart (Marquette):**

1. Has the new master plan for Riding Mountain National Park been completed and, if not, on what date will it be completed?

2. On what date will this master plan be announced to the public?

3. Will public hearings be held on this master plan and, if so (a) on what date (b) will hearings be held in Western Manitoba?

Mr. Len Marchand (Parliamentary Secretary of the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development): 1. The provisional master plan is in its final draft form.

2. The plan will be announced to the public at least 60 days ahead of the public hearing.

3. Yes. (a) priorities associated with the public hearings already held and awaiting decisions make it unlikely that a public hearing for Riding Mountain National Park can be held in 1973. (b) the location of hearings has not yet been fixed.

Eddy Company for the purchase of property in Hull: February 21, 1972, \$1,000,000; March 30, 1972, \$23,000,000; November 27, 1972, \$250,000.
