ACID RAIN—TERMS OF AGREEMENT WITH UNITED STATES— MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

In view of the plans of the Minister of the Environment to conclude a bilateral agreement on the acid rain problem, and because of the double threat posed to Canadian waters by increased tanker traffic on the west coast and the possibility of LNG tankers plying Canadian waters in the Arctic, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Hillsborough (Mr. McMillan):

That this House instruct the Minister of the Environment to include in the bilateral agreement he plans to conclude with the U.S. on acid rain, a compulsory bonding system covering vessels entering our waters so that injured parties will have ready access to compensation commensurate with the damage which could occur from oil spills and LNG accidents.

REUNIFICATION OF FAMILIES—CASE OF LEV OVSISHCHER— MOTION UNDER S.O. 43
