who already believe that Government has grown too large, too remote, too costly, and too intrusive in the day to day lives of Canadians.

I was just getting warmed up, but I get the feeling that we are being called away. Perhaps I can pick this up in September when we return.

ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES READJUSTMENT ACT
