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Newfoundland, would have the whole Benefit of it to themselves; in which Case all the Roman Catholick States must then depend on the English solely for their Baccalio; which, besides the Profits arising immediately from it, would give them almost the whole Trade of the Mediterranean, with an Increase of 27,000 Seamen for the Royal Navy, and put it absolutely in their Power to cut off all Communication between France and Canada, except through the Missippi (as is before observed) and thereby not only render Canada of little or no Utility to the French, but deprive it of all effectual Support from France, against any Attempts of the English for the Reduction of it.

From the State of these two Colonies it is clear, what the Difference would have been to Great Britain in the Course of this War, if instead of the Preservation of Nova Scotia and Reduction of Cape Breton, she had lost the former to the French, and they had kept Posfession of the latter: In that Case, France by gaining the principal Key of the Northern Colonies, extending her Sea Coast 90 Leagues further upon the Atlantic, and augmenting her Territories in Canada, and the Island of Cape Breton with fo large a Provision Country as Nova Scotia, lying contiguous to both of them, would have had it in her Power to introduce and support a Body of regular Troops there, which in Conjunction with the Militia of Canada and the Indians upon the Continent (every one of which, the Six Nations not ex-
