Details of the Important Deal With

an English Company Put Thru

By Mr. Russell.

SHAREHOLDERS MEET JUNE 14.

Directions to Transfer of Stock—

Sales of Mining Issues

Yesterday.

Mr. Richard Russell, president and

managing director of the Fairview Corporation,

has just returned from London, Eng.,

where he put thru a sale of a portion of

the company's properties. Mr. Russell,

on behalf of the corporation, and Mr. Alfred

Moss, on behalf of the prospective pur-

chasers, entered into a preliminary agree-

ment of purchase and sale, which is to be

ratified at a meeting of the corporation,

to be held at Fairview on June 14th next.

Under the terms of the deal the price

for the properties to be transferred is

\$150,000, of which \$100,000 is in cash,

and the remaining \$50,000 in cash, which

will more than pay all existing liabilities

of the company. The amount set

aside as working capital by the English

company is \$50,000, of which \$10,000 has

already been advanced. This is in addi-

tion to the \$400,000 mentioned.

Mr. Russell points out that this does not

interfere with the continued existence of

the Fairview Corp., which still owns other

mining properties, as well as a million

shares of unissued stock. Now the issued

stock of the Fairview Corporation totals

in value about \$150,000. It will be seen,

therefore, that, as the English company is

to pay \$150,000 for the properties, the

Fairview Corporation shareholders are

really getting upwards of \$75,000, or

at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, precisely, to

enter date. Further developments in the

way of sinking, etc., will be prosecuted.

Mr. Russell has been appointed managing

director of the new company.

There are a few points upon which some

of the corporation's shareholders seem to

be at sea. Mr. Russell explains that they

do not give up their Fairview Corporation

stock, which can be dealt in as formerly

upon the Canadian market, and on which

it is expected dividends will be paid from

the profits accruing upon the \$150,000

worth of stock in the English company,

which will be turned over to the Canadian

company.

It is besides the intention of the company

to immediately commence active develop-

ment of the coal lands.
