Mrs. Amy Akorn's Jaw Cut by Stray Bullet From Gallery. -

Mrs. Amy Akorn, wife of Alex Akorn, a ticket-taker, at the World's Strange People sideshow on the Western Fair Midway, was severely injured by a stray bullet from a shooting gallery operated to the south of the Midway on the avenue facing the Transportation building. Mrs. Akorn was at work in the kitchen department of the show commissary, when a bullet whizzed by. cutting into her jaw, and narrowly missing an artery. She suffered another wound in her arm, but whether this was caused by the bullet or by a splinter of wood from the target or side of the shooting gallery, is not known. The physician, who was called to attend her was unable to say. Mrs. Akorn was taken to St. John Ambulance emergency hospital on the grounds, where she remained for some time, but later returned to her tent.

Protests made by the Midway people were effective in inducing the fair directors to force the proprietor of the shooting gallery to better cover the end of the gallery surrounding the target with a view to preventing any more accidents of the kind. It is claimed by the Midway people that ineffectual protests against the danger existing had been made previous to the accident. This is the second accident of the kind that has occurred at the fair during the past few years, a young girl having been similarly injured four years ago.


