

Hockey Detroit Has New Big League

MIDDLE WESTERN HOCKEY LEAGUE

Proposed Circuit to Include Detroit, Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Chicago.

Detroit, Oct. 23.—According to the plans of Harry Brown, manager of the Detroit Arena, Detroit will be one of the cities included in a middle-western hockey league this season.

Mr. Brown has sent out letters to the managers of rinks in Cleveland, Pittsburgh and Chicago asking them to attend a meeting to be held in Cleveland Nov. 4 or 5, with the idea of forming a four-team league to decide the amateur hockey championship for this section of the country.

It is the plan to determine the champion of this district by home-and-home series, the winner playing against the eastern and Pacific coast champions for the national title.

There long has been need of league competition in hockey to decide the sectional championship in a systematic way and there appears to be a good chance that such a league will be formed as Detroit and Chicago are strong for the movement while it is expected that both Cleveland and Pittsburgh, where hockey has thrived for several years, will look on it with favor.

All four of these cities have some good amateur hockey and strict amateur rules will be adhered to. If this is carried out the competition should be well worth while, and an important step toward placing hockey in the United States on a par with that of Canada will have been taken. Chicago and Pittsburgh each boast two rinks, while Detroit and Cleveland each have one.

CRY GOES OUT AGAIN TO CUT THE SALARIES

New York, Oct. 23.—Although the baseball season just ended proved far more successful financially than many believed it would, when this country entered the war, club owners and officials are agreed there is a good deal of work to be done between now and next spring to put the sport on a firmer and more substantial business basis.

It is a well-known fact that many minor leagues will not attempt to play in 1918, unless the war has ended. Of course, the minor leagues are a valuable unit in baseball organization. But more concern is felt for the majors just at this time, and major league conditions will be the first things considered by the "big boys." Once this important problem has been settled, then every ounce of energy will be extended to the minors.

Last winter, there was a prevailing tendency on the part of the leagues not only to cut salaries, but in the majority of instances to reduce player limits as well. More attention was paid to the forming of schedules than ever before. Efforts were made to reduce the mileage as much as possible. In a great measure the officials succeeded. But the year proved they had not gone far enough. In spite of the stern opposition many managers will put up, it is probable that player limits, twenty-five in the American League and twenty-two in the National League, will be reduced.
