Foreign Office Seeks to Remove Ground for Complaint.

LONDON, June 12.—Delays in the transmission of mails which are due to faults in administration have been

ated, according to the British consular office, which is working in conjunction with the French Government in the preparation of a reply to an American note on the subject. The framing of this reply is likely to take some time, as a number of the details set forth in the American note must be investigated. However, the authorities of the foreign office feel that the chief American complaints are due to the application of a principle involved rather than to a disregard of the rights of the United States, and that the specific instances are the past.
