SIR WILFRID'S MISTAKE.

Orangeville Sun: Many of Sir Wilfrid Laurier's friends will regret the savage attack that he made on the principle of public ownership in his speech at Toronto on Friday night. Sir Wilfrid himself will regret it in after years, and it almost makes one doubt whether the premier is really a statesman or merely an "attraction." A large element of the Liberal party is certainly in favor of public ownership, and if the government wants an expression of opinion on the matter let it propose to hand over the Intercolonial Railway, the postal or customs departments to private enterprise. Then there would be such a roar that even the premier, in his defense of public ownership, could not fail to hear. Sir Wilfrid Laurier cannot be so very farseeing after all. He imagines that the public-ownership idea is merely a fad. The principle has come to stay, and inside of five years, to very short time, indeed, the public man who opposes public ownership of railways will be regarded as a fossil. Apparently Sir Wilfrid Laurier is out of touch with the times.

From Waste Fish.

Ottawa, Oct. 21.—Professor Prince, commissioner of fisheries, has returned from visiting fish reduction works at Cape Charles, Virginia, Boston, Portland, Eastport, and other points. The trip was undertaken for the purpose of gaining pointers in connection with similar works which are being established. One of these will be at Canoe, N.B., and two others at points yet to be selected. Codfish and heads and fish waste generally will be treated at the works. Prof. Prince says the cost of the reduction and material is about two or three dollars a ton, whereas the resultant product will bring \$20 a ton. The plant for the three Canadian reduction works has already been shipped.

Land Prices Would Be Unduly Raised—City Hall Happenings.

"There should be some comprehensive park scheme," said Commissioner Spence yesterday when the purchase of the Forest-road lot at \$2350 was discussed. Commissioner Fleming said such a plan would put prices up.

"I don't disagree with Controller Spence very often," said Commissioner Fleming, "but I believe the getting out of a comprehensive plan is the best way of killing our scheme to acquire park lands. If we do prepare a plan and mention the properties we want, prohibitive prices will be asked."

Dr. John Ferguson will be asked to appear before the board to support his request for removal of the 1897 taxes paid by the Western Hospital.

No Resolutions. It was decided to cut out the resolutions in the program for the farewell to Lord Minto.

Manager McGuigan of the G.T.R. had a private conference with the controllers, and said the railways would be pleased to enter into negotiations with the city to depress the tracks in Parkdale. The city engineer will prepare a report as to cost.

City Solicitor Caswell received the order of the railway commission allowing the C.P.R. to construct a siding across Bathurst-street and Albany-street, north of the Conger Coal Co.'s yards.

C. S. Hyman, acting minister of public works, writes that Engineer Gray has been instructed to forward a report at once as to the Island Shore dam.

The Warren Bituminous Paving Co. got the contract to pave Woodlawn-avenue for \$7400.

Commissioner Fleming has reported in favor of the establishment of the following laundries: 1, McLaughlin, West Queen-street; Hop Chong, 228 West Adelaide-street; Charlie Jing, 728 East Queen-street.

Summons of Mr. Fleming. Dr. Sheard has summoned Commissioner Fleming to answer a charge of neglecting to remove refuse from the rear of his property at 291 Parliament-street.

The Sportsman's Paradise.

W. E. Davis, passenger traffic manager, and H. E. Charlton, advertising agent of the Grand Trunk, returned yesterday from Temagami, seventy miles north of North Bay, where they have been "looking over the ground."

The season for moose having opened on the 16th inst., already a considerable influx of sportsmen into that region is in evidence, it being practically the only one in Canada that offers a field for the hunting of the moose.

Denial by Dunderdall.

London, Oct. 21.—Lord Dunderdall, in an interview, states that The Toronto Globe's charge that he had accepted a bribe in Canada is utterly untrue. He states that he has always opposed corruption. He merely revised the adult militia act by the request of the minister, keeping the same principles and introducing no new provisions.

He did not recommend a permanent corps of five thousand. He only proposed power to enlist it, if it was required in future. The charge that he wished the abolition of the schools of instruction is absurd, as these formed an essential part of his scheme. A letter fully explaining these facts is now on its way to Canada.

PRIVATE BANKER'S ESTATE WILL SHOW BIG DEFICIT

Court to Administer Affairs of Late Uriah Thompson of Belleville, Which Are Complicated.

The courts have been asked to settle the affairs of the estate of the late Uriah Thompson, private banker of Belleville, who died on Aug. 24 last. He had been also an express, ticket and telegraph agent and was generally regarded as a wealthy man, but the affairs of his son, Henry C. Thompson, who is executor of the will, declares that the assets consist of buildings in Belleville, mining lands in North Hastings, of uncertain value, interests in the estates of the testator's brother and father, John Kerr Thompson, and John Thompson, of which he was executor.

Also interests in various mining and over companies in Canada, United States and Africa, "nearly all of which is feared is of little value, and regarding the disposition of which I decline to give any advice," declared the executor. The highest estimate of the value of the latter interests is \$30,000.

The widow and son are among the chief creditors, the former for \$3500, money from the estate on her father, the late Henry Porby, while the son claims for \$25,000. He had assisted his father in the business, which, in addition to the private banking, included telegraph and ticket agent for the G.T.R. The son had not for sixteen years drawn all his salary.

There are 195 depositors with claims totaling \$75,000, and other liabilities add \$11,000, while the assets will fall short at least \$25,000. The accounts are in bad shape.

No estimate is made of the real value of the personal estate in any of the papers filed with the executor. It will be impossible to pay the claims in full, especially in view of the fact that the widow and son are among the over-creditors of the deceased, and insists upon payment in full.

Mrs. Emma Rex, a depositor, yesterday asked that the court administer the estate and Henry Thompson was willing.

Ottawa, Oct. 21.—Reports from many districts indicate that potato blight and the are again causing serious loss to the farmers of Canada. This disease has been quite prevalent in various parts of Ontario and Quebec, and has a good preventive is known in the Bordeaux mixture, few growers seem to have sprayed their potatoes.

Mr. Newman of the seed division, who visited nearly every county in Ontario during the summer, first became convinced of the extent of the blight, and reports that in many cases he found growers sadly wanting in knowledge of the disease and methods of preventing it.
