

Extracts from the Statutes of the University of Toronto.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

Four Scholarships will be annually offered for competition, viz.:—

One for Matriculants.

One for Students of one year's standing.

One for Students of two years' standing.

One for Students of three years' standing.

No Scholarship will be awarded to any Candidate unless he shall have been classed in Honors in at least two-thirds of the Departments comprised in the Examination. Each Scholarship is of the value of thirty pounds a year. Each Scholarship is tenable for one year only, but the Scholars of one year are eligible for the Scholarships of the succeeding year.

Students who have not previously Matriculated in any of the Faculties may compete for the Scholarships of the first, second, or third years, by taking, along with the subjects prescribed for that year, the subjects appointed for Matriculation.

Every Student taking a Scholarship is required to sign a declaration that it is his intention to pursue his Medical Studies one, two, or three years, according to the year in which he has taken such Scholarship, and proceed to a Degree in the University of Toronto.

Subjects of Examination for Matriculation.

[Which Examination may be undergone at any time prior to Examination for a Scholarship in Medicine or for the Degree of M.B.]

LATIN—Sallust, Catilina.

MATHEMATICS—Ordinary Rules of Arithmetic. Vulgar and Decimal Fractions. Extraction of the Square Root. First Four Rules of Algebra. (Colenso's.)

ENGLISH—Grammar and Composition.

HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY—Outlines of English History to the present time. (White's History of Great Britain and Ireland.) Outlines of Ancient and Modern Geography. (Schmitz's Manual of Ancient Geography, Anderson's Modern Geography.)
