EXPLORER BACK FROM BAFFIN LAND WITH 3,500 SCIENTIFIC SPECIMENS

Covers Over 4,000 Miles in Two-Year Trip Into Interior; Unmapped Netilling Lake Visited in Voyage by Dog Sled, Boat and Canoe

OTTAWA, Oct. 8.—Some of the results of a "one-man" expedition into the interior of Baffin Island—a previously unexplored part of Canada—were known today with the return to Ottawa of J. Dewey Soper who has been two years in the north.

Mr. Soper covered more than 4,000 miles and has returned with some 3,500 scientific specimens. The department of mines, which sent Mr. Soper into the Arctic, has expressed itself as "very well satisfied with the results attained and adds that many larger expeditions have been out for years and brought back much less scientific information and material."

LAKE EXPLORED

While the complete results of the expedition will not be known until Mr. Soper makes his official report, in an interview today he told of the exploration of Netilling Lake in the interior of Baffin Island with four Esquimaux. The lake has always been unmarked.

On maps of Canada, the work involved more than 1,000 miles of traveling by dog sled, a boat and canoe, and it has been shown that the lake was much smaller than originally supposed.

The 86 cases of specimens collected between July, 1924, and July, 1926, include birds, plants, skulls, insects, fish, geological, ethnological exhibits and photographs and sketches.

Mr. Soper, who has been studying at the University of Alberta, went north on the Arctic in 1923 and did some intensive work while the ship was in its customary cruise. He returned to Ottawa and went north again the following season and remained there until this fall.

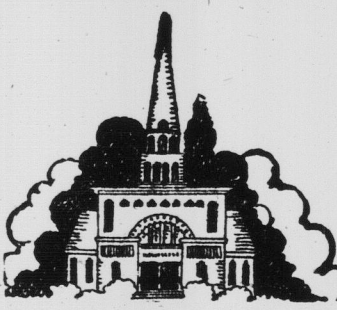

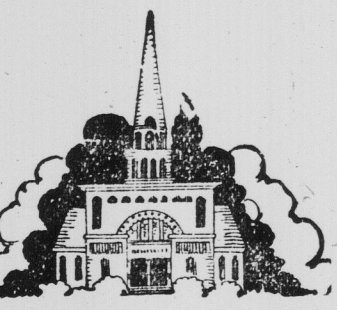
