HAS BIG TASK IN HONG KONG.

O. B. Raven, an architect, formerly with the Dominion Realty Company, Toronto, and now in Hong Kong, has begun an important task in China. Mr. Raven is an Englishman, but spent a few years in Toronto before going to China last year.

He is now engaged in designing a complete university at Amoy, for which a Chinese multi-millionaire is giving his whole time and fortune, with a view to educating the Chinese. This millionaire owns several thousands of acres of rubber plantation in the Malay Peninsula, and has already built kindergarten, primary and secondary schools in his native village near Amoy.

He contemplates a girls' school and a separate boys' school, and later a normal school, so that when the university is built he will have established a complete system from the lowest to the highest grades.




