(Copyright, 1911, by Curtis Brown.) Berlin, Nov. 13—Germany is embroiled in a fierce religious feud, which threatens schism in the dominant evangelical church. It is of more than local significance for the same trouble is smoldering in the English-speaking countries, and for exactly the same reasons—only it is not yet far advanced or so acute as in Germany.

Pastor Jatho is a sixty-year-old parson, so far years past he devoted himself to reading in western Germany a sub-species of Christianity so revolutionary in its character that those who disliked it pronounced it to be not Christianity at all.

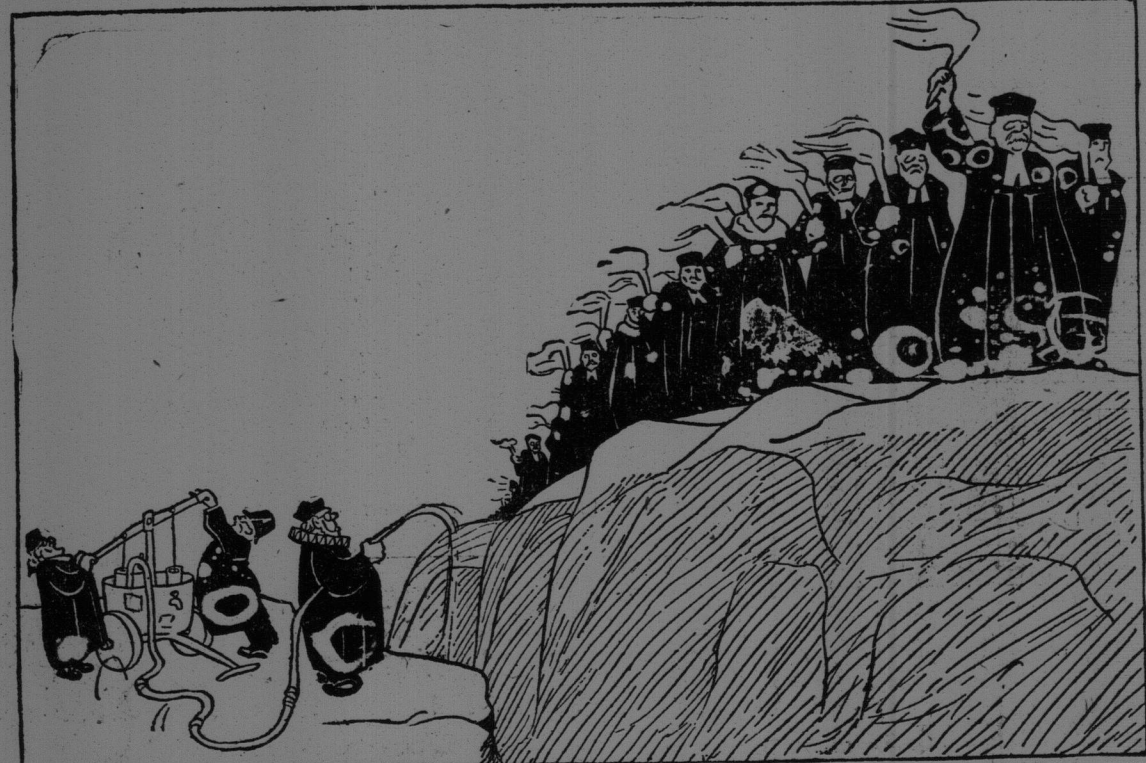

Spinoza, who is rightly regarded as one of Christianity's deadliest foes. Jatho reasons also that the stories of the world are mere inventions, the world being, he holds, governed by immutable cosmic laws. Revelation, he adds, is untrue, and Christianity thereby loses its claim to the absolute and final religion.

How to deal with Jatho, however, has been beyond the resources of the Prussian state hierarchy. The expulsion of Protestant clergymen for heresy is an ancient custom, but Jatho's case is unique in modern Germany.

Expelled. Last year the government determined to persecute, or forbid to preach what he likes, but merely declared that he should no longer be allowed to use a Christian pulpit to undermine the doctrines, tenets and spiritual conceptions of Christianity.

restoration discipline. It got through the Prussian Landtag a project known as the Hersey law, under which was brought into existence a machine for doctrinal inquisition known as the "Spruchkollegium." The "Spruchkollegium" reasoned the government would do the distasteful work rejected by the supreme council and would purge the church of the ever-increasing multitude of heretics and veiled atheists.

Hardly had the grounds for the decree of expulsion been given when the conservative leaders began to fear they had been only too successful. The judgment has at once revealed the enormous extent to which "liberal" that is, pantheistic and anti-revelational ideas, had taken root in the German church and people.

He is Not Alone. Jatho's offense, however, does not lie merely in his heterodoxy. It lies in his heretical success. While the orthodox German preachers often dry and unimpassioned, Jatho is a remarkable man.

If he has driven some conservatives out of his particular fold by his startling doctrines he admittedly has held within the sphere of Christian morals, thousands of doubters and indifferentists, who without him, would have swollen the increasing army of unconcerning secularists. But this kind of success is naturally distasteful to Prussian orthodoxy, and for several years the leaders of the state church have been waiting to give Pastor Jatho a final sentence. The Kaiser's court preacher, Dr. Dryander, Dr. Dryander sat as member of the "Spruchkollegium," and it was he largely to his cross-examination of Jatho and his unfavorable attitude that the judges decided to punish the accused with expulsion from office.
