TELLS OF FOUR DAYS CAREER ON STAGE

Jewel Carmen Sues William Fox
Vaudeville Co. For \$43,500
on Contract.

NEW YORK, May 1.—Jewel Carmen, motion picture actress who is suing the William Fox Vaudeville Company and the Fox Film Corporation for \$43,500 which she says was due her under a contract with the company, was cross-examined in the Supreme Court by counsel for the Fox interests. She admitted that her only theatrical experience before she became a motion picture actress was four days' work as a chorus girl in a company playing in Astoria. She obtained this engagement a few weeks after leaving school. Miss Carmen abandoned a contract with the Fox motion picture concern, and asserted that the agreement was without legal effect because she was not of age when she signed it. Then she made a contract with the Keno company, and she alleges the defendants conspired to prevent the fulfillment of this contract. The defendant insists that Miss Carmen was born in 1895 and not in 1897 as she claims.

3 LEAP TO DEATH FROM N.Y. BUILDINGS

Two Were Patients in Hospitals While Third Was Maid-servant.

NEW YORK, May 2.—Two men, patients in different hospitals, and a maid in a Riverside Drive apartment killed themselves by leaping from high windows.

An excited crowd watched Samuel F. Borrows, an elderly banker of Johnstown, Pa., kick free from the grasp of his nurse and plunge five stories to the pavement. Mr. Borrows had been confined in Miss Frances Schlessinger's private sanitarium for several weeks, suffering from nervous trouble. The nurse grabbed his leg and tried to pull him down, but he kicked her away and wrenched violently at the upper screen. It came away and he tumbled out, turning two somersaults before striking the pavement, 48 feet below.

Jumps From Roof.

Roman Popoff, a patient in Seaview Hospital at New Springville, Staten Island, committed suicide a few hours earlier by climbing his nurse, climbing to the roof of the four-story building and leaping into space.

Hospital authorities said Popoff had been suffering from a nervous disorder and that his mind probably was affected temporarily.

A third suicide was that of Anna Messer, 25, a servant at 420 Riverside.

HUGGINS MAY TAKE SCOTTY FROM GAME

Veteran Shortstop is Slowing up and Wanninger May Replace Him.

NEW YORK, May 2.—A new menace today threatens the playing record of the veteran Yankee shortstop, Everett Scott.

Victor over sickness, injury and transportation tie-up which jeopardized his appearance many times during a career of eleven years in the major leagues, Scott, who has established a mark of playing in more than 1,800 consecutive games, may be compelled shortly, to bow to Father Time.

To Shift Infield

With the New York team steadily slipping—they dropped another one yesterday to the tall end Boston Red Sox, 7 to 5—word emanated from the Yankee camp that Manager Huggins contemplates a shift in his infield which will break Scott's remarkable string. He is seriously considering the replacement of Scott by young Wanninger, when the Yankees return to New York tomorrow to open a series with the Mackmen, in spite of his reluctance to snap the veteran's record of long and faithful service.

Yankee followers point to the fact that Scott's play this year, has evidenced unmistakable signs of a slowing up in the field, while his hitting has never been strong. He is 33 years old.

DAMAGES AWARDED TO W. D. STEEVES

Jury in Woodstock Decides That Defendant Must Pay \$800.

WOODSTOCK, N.B., May 1.—After two hours' deliberation the jury in the Steeves vs. Jones case awarded damages of \$800 to the plaintiff, W. D. Steeves. The case arose out of a collision of automobiles and has been before the Circuit Court in session here throughout the week. The collision occurred last summer and Mr. Steeves brought suit for \$4,500 damages against Mrs. L. B. Jones, because of the damage to his car. Judge Byrne presided. The counsel for Mrs. Jones was Hartley & Hartley and for the plaintiff, Jones & Jones.
