





Makes Comparisons. The report says there has been a more marked improvement in the quality of service, that for the first six months of the preceding fiscal year interruptions to the Saint John service totalled 2 hours 39 minutes and for this year 10½ minutes. The maximum duration of any single interruption this year had been two minutes. On the Moncton line interruptions had been reduced from nine hours twenty-four minutes to one hour three minutes. The report states it is two months since there has been any accidental interruption to the Monc-ton service and three months for the Saint John service.


