Vessels

Ottawa, Oct. 80-The programme of ship construction undertaken by the yielded substantial results. To date fifteen ships have been delivered and are already in service under the direction of the Canadian National Railways. There have been twenty-five sailings, aggregating 116,000 tons of traffic. Voyages have been completed between the Atlantic seaboard and the United Kingdom, and from the Pacific Coast to Great Britain. Thirteen voyages have been completed between Canada and the West Indies and Cuba and to South America, and one to Newfoundland. A service is already under way to Australia and New Zealand, and it is possible that the first ship will be available at Vancouver on or about Dec. 1. Additional sailings will be inaugurated to London, Glasgow, Avonmouth and St. John's, Newfoundland.

When the present government shipbuilding programme is completed sixty vessels will be in service. These will have a dead-weight tonnage of about 282,000 tons.
