

### TWO NATIONS IN TRIBUTE TO GARIBOLDI IN FRANCE

Ceremonies Held at Trocadero on Anniversary of Death of Patriot.

Paris, July 17.—A stirring manifestation of Franco-Italian friendship took place last month at Trocadero, on the anniversary of the death of Giuseppe Garibaldi, June 2, 1882. The ceremonies were held to aid in raising funds for a monument to Italian heroes in Argonne and for the support of their widows and orphans.

Marshal Joffre presided, and at his side were Italian survivors of the campaigns of 1859, 1860, 1870 and '71. They arrived at Paris the day before, under the leadership of Colonel Ricciotti Garibaldi, younger son of the Italian patriot, and General Peppino Garibaldi, son of Ricciotti.

Among those at the ceremonies were General Gouraud and Salvago Raggi, former ambassador from Italy. Colonel Ricciotti Garibaldi read a letter from D'Annunzio. Marshal Joffre presented the Italian central committee with an Italian flag, tied with a bow of tricolor.

### SHOOTS SISTER-IN-LAW WHEN SHE REFUSES RIDE

Husband, With Woman and Daughter in Park, Says Brother Annoyed Wife.

New York, July 17.—Because she refused to go for a ride with him in his automobile, Vincent Mastile, twenty-eight years old, shot his sister-in-law, Mrs. Goldie Mastile, of 2274 Grand Concourse, the Bronx, as she sat on a bench in Poe Park with her husband and her six-year-old daughter. A week ago, the police said, a complaint was made against Vincent by his brother, Harry, who said that Vincent had been annoying his wife.

While Mr. and Mrs. Mastile were seated in the park, Vincent drove up to the curb and asked Mrs. Mastile to go for a ride. When she refused he drew a revolver and shot her. His brother seized Vincent's wrist and misdirected the second and third shots, saving Mrs. Mastile's life. Vincent then ran south on the Concourse and was caught by Patrolman John Riley and locked up in the Bronx Park station. Mrs. Mastile was taken to a hospital.



**MAN HELD UP SIX TIMES IN EIGHT WEEKS CLAIM RECORD**

Detroit, July 17.—Add to the list of record claimants the name of George Baker, Royal Oak granger owner, who believed himself to be the "most held up" man in the country.

Baker, who sleeps in the rear of his garage, was aroused by a sound at the door. He sprang for his shotgun, but the intruder got his revolver working first. One bullet grazed Baker's face, another passed through his hand. Baker sent a broadcast from the shotgun at the prowler, who escaped in an automobile.

In six holdups in which he has participated unwillingly during the last eight weeks, Baker has shot two of the bandits and captured three.

**FINDS SAVING IN COST OF MAKING ELECTRICITY**

Washington, July 17.—(A. P.)—The United States is becoming an increasingly heavier user of electricity, but despite the mounting power totals, the consumption of fuel to produce it is decreasing in proportion. Geological survey figures show that the consumption of coal for that purpose in 1922 was only 2.5 pounds a kilowatt hour, as compared with 3.2 pounds in 1919. A total of 47,659,000,000 kilowatt hours was generated last year. Of this amount 86.1 per cent. was generated by water power. New York leads


