

Over \$40 but not exceeding \$50 - 25 cts Over \$50 but not exceeding \$60 -Over \$60 but not exceeding \$70 - 35 ots Over \$70 but not exceeding \$80 - 40 cts over \$90 but not exceeding \$100 50 ets Maximum amount of a single Order to any of the above countries and at offices in Newfoundland, \$100, but as many may be obtained as the remitter requires.
