LIBERAL MAJORITY WILL BE SIXTY-THREE OR MORE

They Came Out On Top in Every Province Except Ontario and P. E. I., Conservative Gains in Quebec—One Nova Scotia Seat Still in Doubt.

LIBERAL MAJORITY WILL BE SIXTY-THREE OR MORE. (Special to the Star.) MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—The federal elections held yesterday resulted in the return to power of the Laurier government by a majority of about sixty-three.

There are some notable changes in the personnel of the house. The feature of the election in Montreal was the election of H. B. Ames, over Peter Lyall, in St. Antoine, by 538 majority. The other city constituencies went as in last election.

Ontario returned 48 Conservatives, 38 Liberals, as compared with 55 Conservatives and 37 Liberals in the last house. A notable feature in Ontario was the defeat of Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, the new cabinet minister. Manitoba has elected six Liberals and three Conservatives. One election is yet to be held, making ten seats. In the last house out of seven members, there were three Liberals and four Conservatives.

THE TRIUMPH IN YORK. (Special to the Star.) FREDERICTON, N. B., Nov. 4.—The complete returns from York give Crockett a majority of 184. The crisis was a dumb and sorely depressed. When it is considered that on their side was arrayed the greatest campaign fund seen in York, all the influence of the local government and the transfer of the Canada Eastern and the whole Gibson interest, Mr. Crockett's victory is a great triumph. If such influences had not existed the result would have been different.
