## BAPTISTS DENOUNCE THE BOOK WRITTEN BY REV. H. F. WARING

WOODSTOCK, N. B., June 11.—At the afternoon session of the Baptist Association today the officers elected for the ensuing year were announced as follows: Rev. J. H. McDonald, of Fredericton, moderator; Rev. D. Hutchinson, of St. John, assistant moderator; F. W. Emmerson, clerk; James Patterson, treasurer. Members of executive—Dr. McLeod, B. H. Nobles, E. J. Grant, Dr. Kierstead, Dr. McIntyre, D. Hutchinson, C. T. Phillips, J. LeTorne and C. T. Wayman. Members from St. John for H. M. Board—W. H. White, R. G. Haley, Rev. Wellington Camp. Colonel Vince called attention to the fact that while there should be five hundred ministers and delegates present at this association there were only 35 delegates and 41 ministers, or one-seventh of the whole.

The committee on denomination was instructed to attempt to remedy this. The thanks of the association were heartily passed to the church choir and people for their hospitality.

On a resolution of thanks to the proprietors and editors of the Maritime Baptist for the excellency of the paper and urging its reception in every home Rev. E. J. Grant, Dr. Creed and Rev. C. P. Wilson desired that the paper should make a firm, outspoken pronouncement against the dangerous teachings of the so-called "new theology," as enunciated in Rev. Mr. Waring's book. The resolution was adopted.

It was resolved that a Provincial B. G. P. Union be organized to meet September or October and that a committee of five be appointed to carry this into effect.

A resolution of thanks to Miss Gaudin, in India, for her letter, was passed. Resolved that a course of study be inaugurated in missions, Sunday school work and the Bible.

Resolved that it is the duty within the province to attend the association unless prevented by some worthy excuse. A resolution of sympathy was passed in regard to Rev. J. J. Barnes and T. G. DeWitt, and hopes expressed for their recovery.

It was resolved to proceed with the ordination of T. S. Pater, M.A., C. A. Callahan, Perry R. Hayward and M. L. Orchard, B.A., and further resolved, that Geo. Halister, H. McGill, F. Orchard and J. S. Sharp be given association license.

Rev. D. Hutchinson preached the ordination service. "We are laborers together with God," Mr. McIntyre presented the candidates, Dr. McLeod questioned them, Rev. C. T. Phillips delivered the ordination prayer, Rev. John Hughes gave the charge to the candidates, and Rev. "Father" Noble spoke to the people. There were receipts for home mission work, \$3,780.77; expenditures, \$3,678. It was resolved that henceforth the books of the association treasurer should be closed June 30th and that a report be presented to the association. It was also resolved that the report and financial statement of the home mission board be printed and submitted to the final session of the association. The appointment of denominational funds was left to the executive. Rev. J. B. Daggett was elected assistant secretary, Dr. McLeod corresponding secretary, Col. Vince auditor, Col. Vince, Woodstock and Dr. Creed, Fredericton, were appointed delegates from this association to the Maritime convention. The evening session was taken up by an address by T. S. Simms of St. John, on his recent trip to the missions in India. Miss Harrison, a returned missionary from India, spoke of the work there. Dr. McIntyre spoke on home missions. The association then adjourned.
