Advanced Another Step. London, Aug. 12.—Lord Haldane's appellate jurisdiction bill, which has already been approved by the House of Lords, and which provides for two additional judges to sit on the judicial committee of the privy council, passed its third reading in the House of Commons last night.

Body Found in Harbor. The body of Matthew Crane was found in the harbor yesterday morning about seven o'clock. The discovery was made by Kendrick Outhouse, who saw the body floating in the water about ten feet from the wharf adjoining the fish premises of Leonard Bros. Crane was about 50 years of age and was quite familiar about the city.

Commissioner Schofield will take a three weeks vacation having been ordered by his physician to take a rest. His work will devolve on Mayor Frink.

Succeeds H. H. Schaefer. S. G. Timin, recently appointed divisional freight agent for the I. C. R. here, came into the city yesterday to enter upon his new duties. Mr. Timin has for several years been the I. C. R.'s general agent in Toronto. In coming here he succeeds H. H. Schaefer, who will be stationed in Montreal.

The Word "Roman." Vancouver, B. C., Aug. 12.—A vigorous protest against the use of the word "Roman" before Catholic, in referring to the Catholic Church, was entered by Archbishop Casey in the course of a sermon at St. Patrick's church. The Archbishop said the official title was "The Catholic church."

Art Critic Killed. New York, Aug. 12.—David C. Preyer, an art critic of international reputation, fell early today from a window on the fifth floor of an apartment house in Central Park West, and was instantly killed. Mr. Preyer was 60 years old.
