MARINE NOTES OF THE WORLD

MARITIME EVENTS.

Baltimore, Oct. 25—Sch. Carrie B Wright which stranded in the Potomac in last week's gale, was floated by revenue cutter Apache. The Wright rudder and boat.

Vineyard Haven, Mass., Oct. 23—Sch. Rebecca J. Moulton, from South Amboy for Portland, which stranded on East Chop, was floated this morning by tug Taseo and was towed to Woods Hole. Before she was pulled off about 100 tons of coal was lightered and vessel pumped out.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Reported to the Hydrographic office (New York):

Str. Essex reported Oct. 27 about 3 miles S by E 1/2 E (mag) of Northeast End lightship, passed a part of a vessel's deck about 30 feet square.

Str. Torr Head reports Oct. 16, lat 14 13 N, lon 62 47 W, passed some logs and Oct. 17 lat 15 56 N, lon 63 12 W, a log standing upright and projecting about 8 feet out of water.

It is reported that on Oct. 17 the sea rocks of the derelict Str. Volturo were opened and she sank.

ASHORE ON MARSH.

Moncton Transcript: The schooner W. H. Waters got caught in last week's big storm while running up the river toward Dorchester. When off Grindstone island the captain dropped two anchors but both cables parted and the vessel was compelled to run before the gale, being finally beached on the salt marsh near Dorchester. When the tide went down the vessel was left stranded high and dry on the marsh, and it was in that position several days until the crew was able to get her off on an exceptionally high tide.

BARK PATRIE BURNING.
