

MR. BENTLEY'S DISHONEST ATTEMPT TO DECEIVE THE ELECTORS OF ST. JOHN COUNTY

His Serious and Untruthful Charge Against the Licensees of Lumber Lands, Declaring That They Had Slaughtered the Lands From 1908 to 1912.

Mr. A. F. Bentley is an opposition candidate, the running mate of leader Foster in the county of St. John. When a member of the Legislature Mr. Bentley was a tame follower of the old government, and as such had the privilege of obstructing the public roads of the country with the pulp wood that he got out in St. John county.

In his speech at Fairville the other night Mr. Bentley made the charge against the lumbermen of the province that between 1908 and 1912 the lumbermen who were lessees of Crown lands slaughtered the Crown lands of the province, rather than cut lumber on their own private lands. The only excuse for making such a charge against his brother lumbermen was that they thought their lease of Crown lands was expiring in 1918 "and," continued Mr. Bentley, "was it natural to assume that they would cut on their own private properties to save the Crown lands? No! They cut to the very extreme on the Crown lands and conserved the resources was far in excess of the increase in stumpage collections."

According to the Telegraph's report Mr. Bentley also spoke of the reduction of the size of the cut log, "which was steadily depleting the resources of the Crown lands." Now for the facts: There was no reduction in the size of the cut log from 1908 to 1912 but on the Crown lands from 1908 to 1912 that for the same period preceding the overthrow of the old government in 1908, but there was an honest collection of stumpage instead of a stumpage running from 35 to 50 per cent. as was the case under the old government. MAGNIFICENT SHOWING BY MURRAY GOVERNMENT WITH RESPECT TO BRIDGES

The Present Government Spent Nearly Three Times As Much on Permanent Bridges in the Nine Years They Have Been in Power As the Old Government Had Spent in the Previous Twelve Years.

Although the old government had issued bonds earlier for the building of permanent bridges, very little was done by them in that line until 1896. Of course bonds issued before that purpose had been ignored before that date, but most of the money realized for those bonds had gone into the repairing of dilapidated ordinary bridges, much against the protest of the then opposition in the legislature. A comparison of what was spent by the old government from 1896 to 1907, inclusive, on account of permanent bridges, and what was expended by the present government from 1908 to 1916, inclusive, on the same service, will show how large sums of money in recent years have been spent on permanent structures, rather than wasted, as was too often the case in former days.
