

CARLETON WILL HAVE SOLDIER ON ITS BALLOTS

Liberal Convention at Woodstock a "Fizzle" With Only Twenty-four Present.

Woodstock, N. B., Sept. 23.—The situation in the provincial field of politics in Carleton County is very unsettled. S. J. Barber, of Arundale, has issued his card and says he will certainly see the fight through as the candidate of the returned soldiers, who will place no other candidate this time. Hon. R. Frank Smith has decided to abandon party affiliation and will be in the contest as an independent and receive a strong vote from the farmers.

The Government convention here this afternoon, was a fizzle. It was decided to adjourn the convention, which was called to nominate candidates for a week. There were only 24 people present. Twenty of the twenty-four were government officials. All the leading Liberal politicians were absent. Speeches were made by Mr. Cameron, of Bath, the Chairman, Dr. Griffin of Woodstock and Mr. Campbell, Government superintendent of bridges for this district. Some remarks were made from the benches by a few road superintendents.

Soldier Candidate

Samuel Barber, of Arundale, the soldier candidate, appeared before the meeting and requested that only two nominees be made on the ticket and a vacancy left so that his name may be added. He intended to make the same request of the managers of the Opposition and United Farmers' tickets. Up to the present time the United Farmers have made no change in their ticket, nominated some months ago, and it remains as follows: Councillor Fred W. S. Tracy, of Windsor, Coun. Rennie Tracy, of Wexford, and Samuel J. Burlock, of Mount Pleasant. The Opposition will make no move until W. S. Sutton, M. L. A. returns from the St. John Convention.

HIGH SCHOOL CLASS STRIKES TO VISIT THE HORSE RACING

Fredericton, Sept. 23.—Members of the two senior classes at the Fredericton High School held meetings at noon today and decided not to attend the session of the school. This action followed a request for a half holiday, which the teachers were unable to grant upon the grounds that the authority rested with the board of trustees. The holiday was asked because all stores, wholesale houses and factories in Fredericton were closing in order that the staffs might attend the last day of the harness racing season in Fredericton.

Dr. G. C. Vanwart, chairman of the Board of School Trustees when told that the students in two classes at the High School had held meetings and decided to take a holiday, remarked: "I haven't heard anything about a half holiday, but if they don't want to go to school I suppose we can't make them."

About this time last year the students at the High School "took" a holiday in the same way to attend the exhibition, which was then in progress here.

"DRIVEN OUT BY PROHIBITION" PLEA

QUEEN'S MAIDS TO QUIT UNLESS THEY CAN LIVE OUTSIDE

London, Sept. 23.—The royal housemaids in Buckingham Palace are demanding the right to "live out," following the action of the majority of girl shopworkers and domestic servants in London. In their petition Queen Mary they asked for an eight-hour day with permission to live out if they so desired. The King and Queen granted the eight-hour day, though it involved the employment of a dozen extra maids, but they declined to grant the demand for the privilege of living out. The petition was similar to one presented to Queen Alexandra by the maids at the Marlborough House. Queen Alexandra granted the request, but Queen Mary again refused. All the housemaids have tendered a month's notice of their intention to give up their positions unless the request is conceded.
